
On this date, we, the Board of Trustees of the **Cross Plains Independent School District**, hereby levy or set the tax rate on \$100 valuation for the District for the tax year **2021-2022** at a total tax rate of **\$ 0.9857**, to be assessed and collected by the duly specified assessor and collector as follows:

\$ **0.9857** for the purpose of maintenance and operations, and


\$ **0.00** for the purpose of payment of principal and interest on debts.

Such taxes are to be assessed and collected by the tax officials designated by the District.
